Unstructured time outdoors—like playing in a stream, building a fort in the woods, hanging out in a field or spending time hunting or fishing—enhances the health of our kids.






2014 Income

Do you want to make an investment in protecting the mountain streams, wildlife and ranching that nurtures so many?


It is possible by making a **planned gift** to the Kaniksu Land Trust. There are many ways to do this.
